FACILITIES AND RESOURCES

COLLEGE LOCATIONS

Glebe Campus

Centrally located in the Sydney CBD, Bedford College is directly opposite Sydney University and just a short stroll from the Broadway Shopping and Cinema Complex. Restaurants, Banks, Post Office, etc. are all only a few minutes' walk from the College. We are five minutes by bus from Central Railway Station and the bus stops at the door.

Facilities – Glebe Campus

Business/Management - Level 1

Completely re-furnished in 2011, the business/management campus is light and airy and the training facilities and resources are exceptional. The business campus includes a Client Common Room (table tennis & board games etc.), full kitchen and a Client Study Room. Child Care/Community services - Ground Floor

The Early Childhood campus was purpose built to replicate a real-life child care centre where clients learn in a simulated early childhood setting. Norwest Campus

Conveniently located in the Norwest Business Park, the new Norwest Campus opened in January 2014. The Campus is a state-of-the-art facility in a beautiful location with lots of outdoor relaxing areas and close to transport and all facilities.

Facilities - Norwest Campus

The facilities at the Norwest Campus are similar to the Glebe Campus and offer clients the very latest technology and resources in a relaxing and motivational learning environment. Student parking is also available.

ATTENDANCE

Business & Leadership and Management clients

- Attend College three days per week from 9.00am to 3.00pm, one day online and one day work placement is recommended
- Undertake 35 hours (one week) Work Placement in week 30

Early Childhood & School Age Education and Care clients

- Attend College three days per week from 9.00am – 3.00pm, one day per week online and practicum, one day per week in a registered early childhood centre
- Undertake 2 x 2 week block (4 weeks) Practicum Placements in a registered early childhood centre during terms 2 and 3

Community Services clients

- Attend College three days per week from 9.00am to 3.00pm, one day online, one day practicum in a community based service

Student Support

At Bedford College, we aim to provide a warm, friendly environment for students. Most clients find that they make friends very quickly and get support from teachers, admin staff and other students. However, some students may require additional assistance, which is available every day between 3.00pm – 4.00pm with individual teachers. In addition, we offer a English support class one afternoon per week for those international students who may need further clarification or explanation of work or assignments. .

Academic Counselling

Bedford College will make every effort to assist clients who require help in the learning process. Advice on academic issues can be provided by individual teachers, the Deputy Principal (Business clients) and the Course Coordinator (Child Care clients)

Personal Counselling

Some clients may experience unexpected personal problems when studying – particularly if the client is new to Sydney and living away from home, family and friends – and this is where personal counselling may help. Counselling can be for a variety of reasons, such as difficulty structuring a study routine, problems adjusting to living away from home or other personal issues.
